On December 09, 2003, at 15:26 CDT, in Ft Hancock, TX, on the Valentine Subdivision, westbound IMNLB 07, on the main track, at MP 780.7, reported the westbound approach signal to SA738, East Iser, was vellow over yellow, and the next westbound signal at SA738 was red.

An investigation revealed a defective 120 CDF (code following relay) allowed the WDDR to energize while receiving 75 code.

The relay was replaced, and all applicable tests were performed.
