A failure should not be counted more than one time in items 1, 2, 3, and 4; the failure should be classified under the pasic system or appliance of which it forms an essential part. E.g.; assume grounds cause a block signal to indicate a false proceed causing corresponding indications of a cab signal system on each train approaching this point, such failures should be included in item 1, Block Systems.

A (alse proceed failure is a failure of a system, device or appliance to indicate or function as intended which results in less restriction than intended.

NATURE AND CAUSE OF FAILURE/CORRECTIVE ACTION TAKEN

On July 31, 1996 at approximately 4:30 PM, the train crew operating the No. 1L374L2-31 traveling East, reported that Signal 30 was YELLOW over YELLOW when the next signal was RED over RED. The proper aspect for Signal 30 should have been RED over YELLOW.

Under the direction of Signal Supervisor the signal system was immediately put to stop. The signal system was inspected and thoroughly tested and found to be working as intended with no exceptions.

The signal system was returned to service on August 1, 1996 at 11:00 AM.
